Overview of the Event / How Was DCS Used: Primary point for security and medical comms. coordination. We operated 24/7 during the operation.

Suggestions / Issues: Even though we operated simplex at the park, which was fine, the use of K6CPT/EOB for talk-in purposes and safety check-ins did not work well, cell phones were used to cover this gap. Without the aid of DCS BSA security would not have been nearly as effective. Due to good log keeping, by DCS, LAC Lifeguards were able to fill in the holes in their reports. DCS was involved in 3 serious medical and two lost children incidents. All of which had a good outcome. This was an excellent experience for DCS. A few more people would have come in handy on Saturday; however, because of the dedication and fine work put in by the crew on hand everything was handled in good fashion.

SUBJECT: THE SERVICE OF THE LOS ANGELES DISASTER COMMUNICATION SERVICE IN SUPPORT OF THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY COUNCIL, BSA'S CENTENNIAL COUNCIL JAMBOREE AT FRANK G. BONELLI PARK ON MAY 21-23, 2010

Dear Mr. Farrell,

As you are aware, the San Gabriel Valley Council, BSA in conjunction with the Verdugo Hills Council, BSA held their Centennial Council Jamboree ("CCJ") at Frank G. Bonelli Regional Park from May 21st through May 23rd this year. This was a multi-faceted event in celebration of Boy Scouting's 100th anniversary that encompassed the entire West Valley and East Valley segments of the park. The event comprised of a Cub Scout Cub-O-Ree, a Boy Scout kayak competition at the waterfront, Scout skill competitions, fun events, vendor booths, and merit badge advancements opportunities. The Saturday events concluded with an evening stage show. Sunday morning breakfast preceded religious services for various denominations followed by a number service projects within the park. The service projects included the dedication of Centennial Grove by LA County Supervisor Mike Antonovich where one hundred trees were planted by the Boy Scouts in recognition of Scouting's 100th anniversary. The CCJ had over 2,500 Scouts and Scouters who camped in the park on Friday and Saturday nights. An additional 2,000 - 2,500 day visitors joined the celebration on Saturday.

Events as large as the CCJ require an extensive amount of planning and coordination in their execution. In addition to the planning and coordination efforts, we were delighted to have had the very capable services of the Los Angeles Disaster Communication Service ("LADCS") for the entire event. The LADCS message center was professionally and efficiently run by well staffed personnel who were also well trained, well equipped, and self sufficient. Their ability to adapt to the needs of the Scouting community was truly remarkable. Each task was performed promptly and thoroughly by an amiable and professional group of people. The performance of LADCS service was nothing short of excellent. There is no doubt that the efforts of the LADCS enhanced the safety and security of the CCJ for thousands of Scouts and Scouters in attendance.
